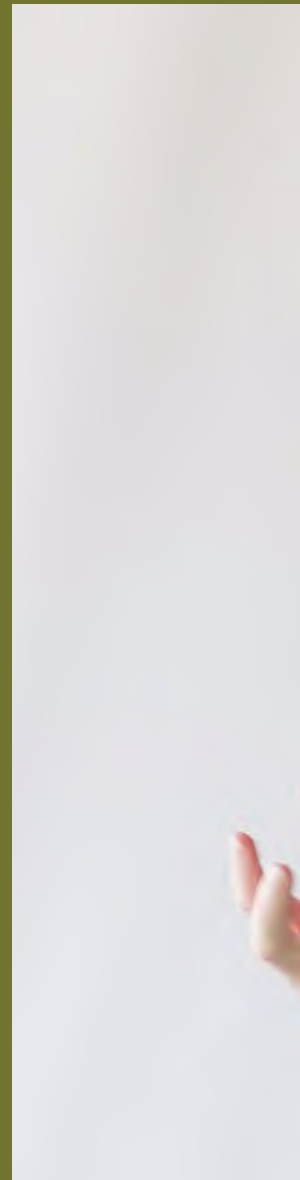

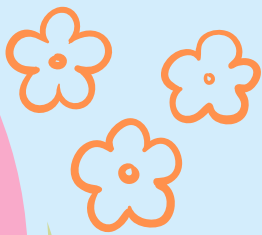






HAPPY TEACHER'S DAY

Tet Event

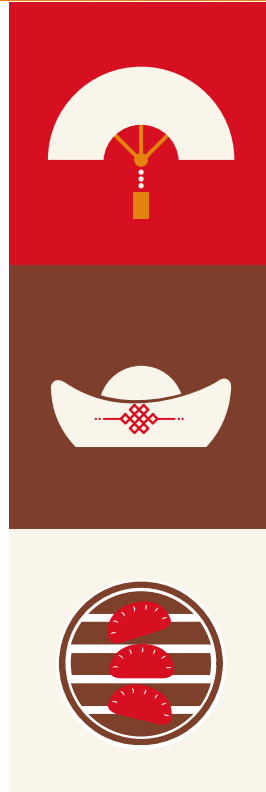
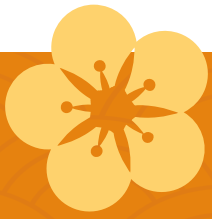

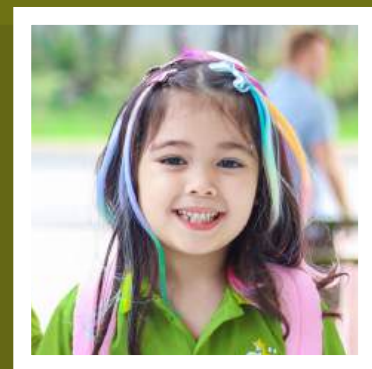
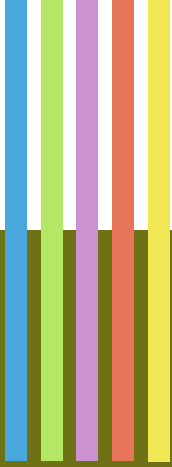




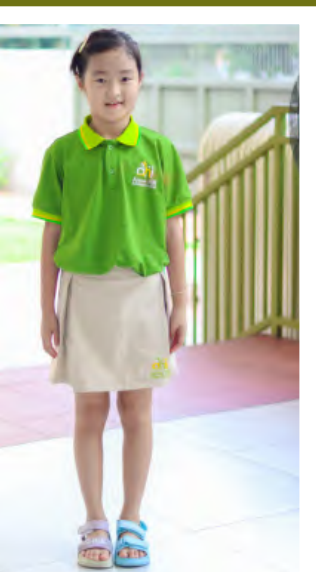
SPORTS WEEK

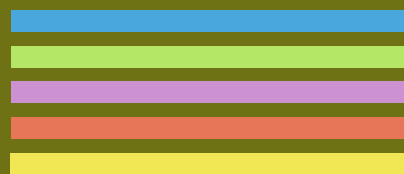


Anti-Bullying Week

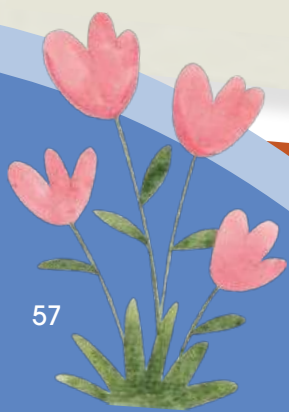


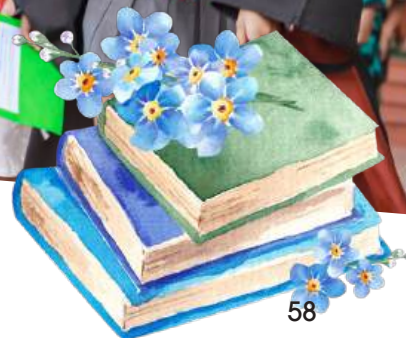
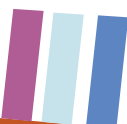


Primary World Book Day

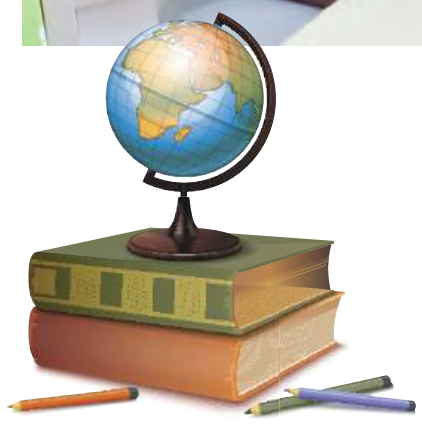
Y6 Collaboration With Singapore Students

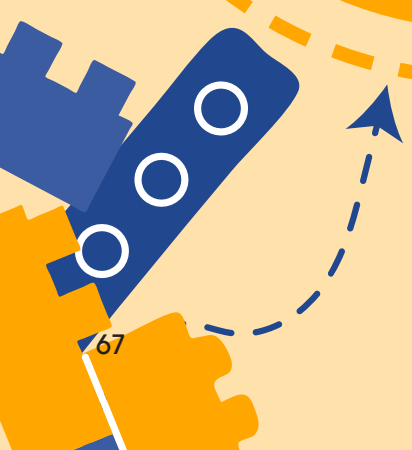
GERMS LEARNING IN NUSERY 1

In Nursery 1, we dedicated a whole week to studying germs. We learnt that germs vary in size and colour, being quite different from each other. Although we cannot see them, they are always around us. To reinforce this knowledge, we created a poster to remind us of the presence of germs in our lives and how to avoid them. Activities like this also allow students to practise working in a group, which is one of the core social skills.

We used a “blowing paints” technique to create images of germs with the help of straws. While completing this task, students learnt to control the airflow and direct it in a desired way to create germ-like pictures. It was a brand new activity for the kids, bringing so much joy and fun to everyone!







A ROBOT RUMPUS IN NURSERY 2

The children explored the theme “My Toy Shop” by making and decorating their own robots within their groups. They identified and named the robot’s body parts and even learned to speak like one, just like in the book we read – “Harry and the Robots”! They used their language skills in play situations and a variety of developmentally-appropriate contexts, such as role-play, storytelling, and giving and receiving instructions.

They also explored size and shape through construction materials, puzzles, modelling, and creative activities. This activity was not only fun but also a great way to problem-solve, think critically, and use their imagination to be creative in building their own robots out of different items in the classroom.

The children had an incredibly engaging and enriching experience during the “To the Rescue - Superheroes” unit! Starting the year with such an exciting and memorable theme must have set a fantastic tone for the rest of the academic year. The progression from creating superhero costumes to immersing themselves in role-playing activities shows a thoughtful and comprehensive approach to learning. It’s wonderful to hear how the children were able to develop various skills and enjoy themselves throughout the unit. The integration of hands-on activities like making masks, wristbands, and capes likely made the learning experience even more meaningful and enjoyable for the students.





“Supermarket” Experience in Kindergarten Class



We embarked on an exciting journey to bring the supermarket experience into our classrooms, intertwining learning in Maths and Understanding the World. Through hands-on activities, our young learners explored mathematical concepts such as counting, sorting, and comparing while engaging in role-playing scenarios as shoppers and cashiers. As they navigated through the aisles, they gained a deeper understanding of the world around them, learning about different foods, currencies, and cultures. By immersing themselves in this interactive learning environment, our students not only honed their mathematical skills but also developed a broader perspective of the diverse community.
