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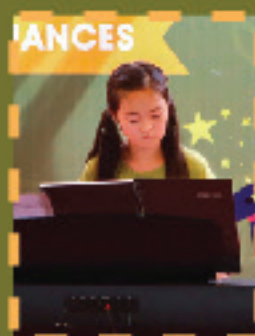




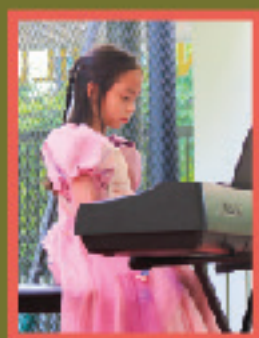
# Talent Show

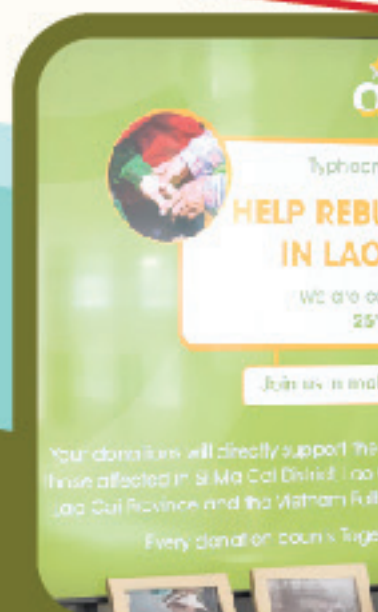

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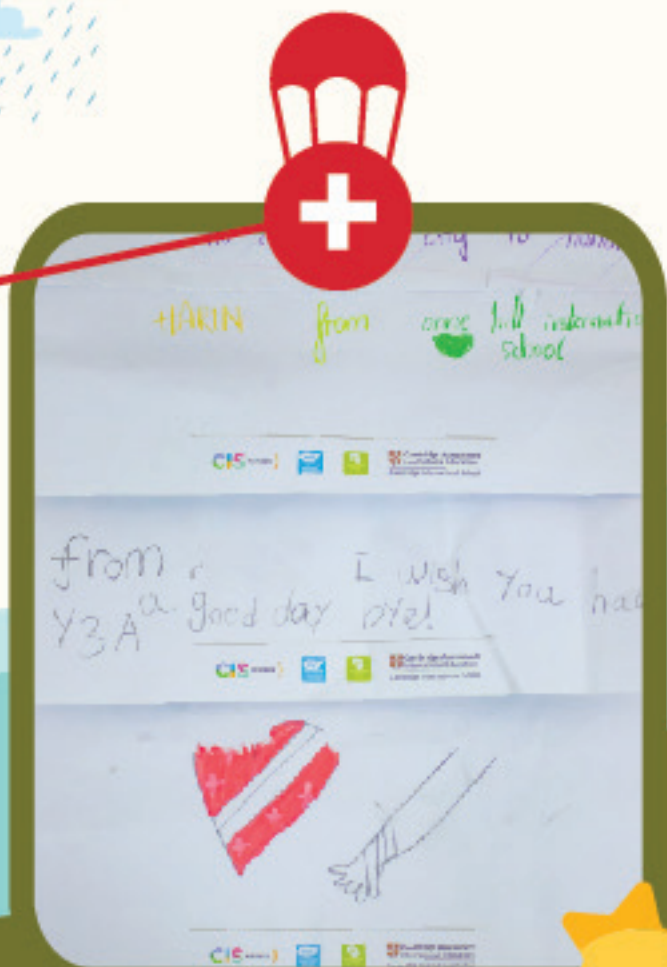




# YAGI TYPHOON DONATION DRIVE

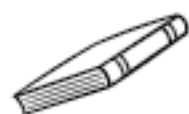
## My Class's Journey

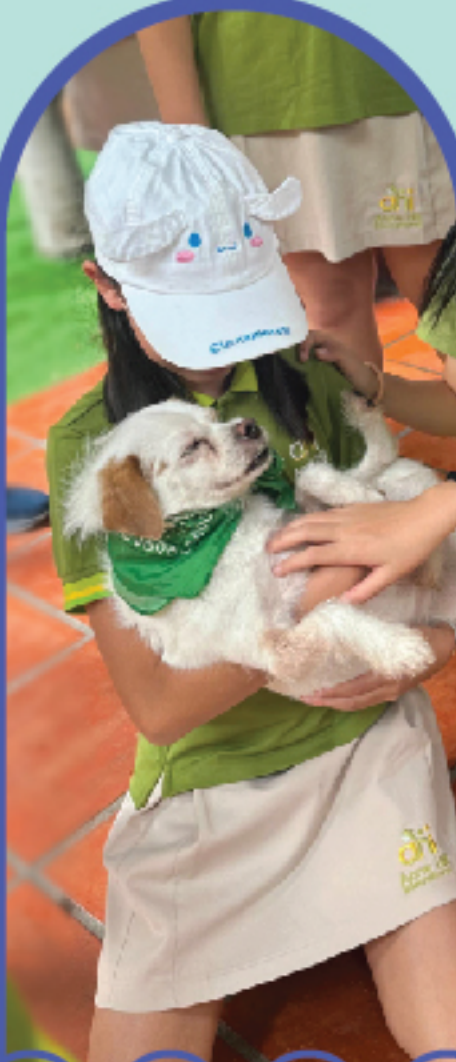


